Terry Medwick Bethel, age 80, of Hendersonville, passed away Monday, June 17, 2019 at NHC Springfield, Tennessee.

Mr. Bethel was born on July 14, 1938 in Monette, Arkansas to the late James Elvis and Ethelyn Hancock Bethel.

In addition to his parents Mr. Bethel is preceded in death by his wives, Patricia Wainscott Bethel and Billie Jo Spears Bethel; and his sister, Sherry Gold.

Mr. Bethel is survived by his children, Valerie (Jeff) Rogers, Michelle Sterling, and Mike Bethel, all of Hendersonville, Barbara (Terry) Morris of Ashland City and Stephen (Linda) Bethel of Greenbrier; brother, Bill (Margie) Bethel of Hot Springs, AR; 10 grandchildren; and 15 great-grandchildren; and several nieces and nephews; and many dear friends. Mr. Bethel started his career at an early age playing the Steel Guitar, he had worked with several entertainers such as Casey Clark and the Lazy Ranch boys, The Leon Boulanger Band, Ferlin Husky and The Hushpuppies, Claude Gray, The Borrowed Band, Jerry Lane & Niteline, Loretta Lynn, Billie Jo Spears and Mel Tillis and The Statesiders. Mr. Bethel toured all over the United States, Canada and Europe, he also did a USO tour. He was the founder of Ozark Steel Guitar Association. He also received several awards

He was the founder of Ozark Steel Guitar Association. He also received several awards over the years including being inducted into The Steel Guitar Hall of Fame in 2012 and NTSGA Legends Award in 2017. Mr. Bethel designed and built his own Bethel Steel Guitar.

He retired and moved back to Nashville from Branson MO., that he had called his home for over 20 years. He came home to spend his last years with his children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren. His wishes were to be cremated, and he will be laid to rest with his wife Pat, in Everest Cemetery in Pleasant View, TN in a private family burial. 


