Age 79 of White House went home to be with the Lord Tuesday, December 15, 2020 at Hendersonville Medical Center. He was born June 18, 1941 in Providence, Rhode Island to Edward Steven & Charlotte Ann Cocayne Townsend. After graduating from BHS he attended Cerritos Junior College at night for 3 years while working at Fedco. He was promoted at Fedco from the warehouse into management. He spent a year at L.A. Trade Tech in East LA while working for Fedco in traffic management. He met his wife Norma, who also worked at Fedco, and they were married in 1961. He retired in 1987 after 31 years of service with Fedco. While working at Fedco he served as President of the California Shippers Association for three years. After retirement, he worked for Osh-Kosh B'Gosh for 14 years and retired from them in 2005. He then became a service writer for Wal-Mart. He was a member of New Life Fellowship, where he served as a trustee.

He is preceded in death by his parents; wife, Norma Townsend.

He is survived by his son, Greg (Laura) Townsend, White House, TN; 3 grandchildren, Matthew Kondus, David Townsend and Bailey Townsend; 5 great-grandchildren, Matthew, Allie, Addisyn, Everett & Bennett. 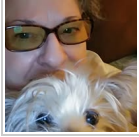
