



Alex Sandor Kiss

July 16, 1936 - November 29, 2008

Kiss, Alex Sandor went to be with his Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ on Saturday November 29, 2008. Funeral services will be 1pm Wednesday December 3, 2008 at White House United Methodist Church with Rev. Steven Lee & Rev. Randy Brown officiating. Interment will follow at White House Memorial Gardens. Visitation with family will be Tuesday 4 to 8pm at Austin & Bell Funeral Home, White House and Wednesday from 11:30am until time of services at the church. Survived by wife of 40 years, Nellie L. Walker Kiss; stepson, Sonny (Sherry) Sarver; niece, Erika Kiss. Alex was born July 16, 1936 in Dunavecse, Hungary. Alex left his native country (after its revolt against the russians in 1956) due to his involvement as a "Freedom Fighter" in that conflict. Eventually arriving in the USA, Alex accepted a job with Kerrigan, Ironworkers in Nashville, Tn. He soon served 2 years in the Army and became a Naturalized Citizen in 1965. Alex and Nellie moved to White House, Tn. in 1971 where they resided until his passing. He retired from Power and Equipment Company of Nashville in 1999 where he had worked since 1973. Alex was widely known across the State of Tennessee for his outstanding career as a soccer player, referee and instructor. His 50 years in soccer lead to his induction in the Hall of Fame on February 24, 2006. Austin & Bell Funeral Home, White house, 615 672 5000.
