Alfred Allen Kilgore, age 59, of Greenbrier, passed away suddenly Wednesday, July 1, 2009 at Baptist Hospital at the beginning of a valiant battle with liver cancer. Funeral services were conducted Friday, July 3 at 12 noon in the chapel of Austin & Bell Funeral Home with Rev. Bill Reding officiating. Burial followed in the Robertson County Memorial Gardens with family and friends serving as pallbearers.
