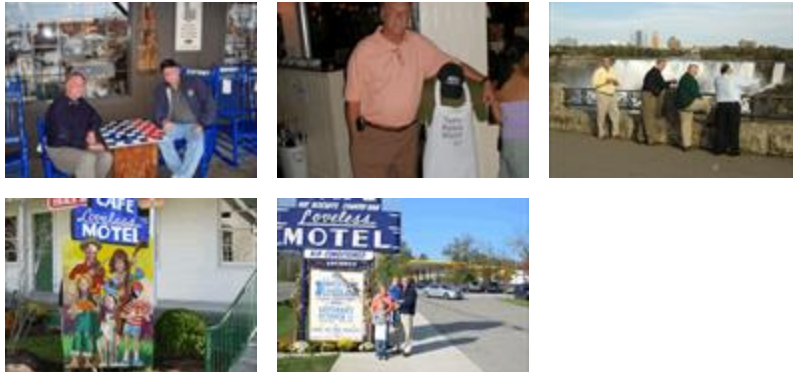

“ Glenn Greer is a central figure in so many fond memories of my boyhood. An announcement from our parents that we were going to visit the Greers always elicited the greatest excitement from us kids, not least because "Mr. Greer" could be counted on to make us roll with laughter. As a young boy I remember looking up at his tall figure to see his characteristic wide smile and receive a witty remark which I would be sure to understand in 10 years but at the present served mainly to give me only an increasing interest in all things adult and manly. I used to love to listen to the conversation he would have with my late father, Jan Willis. Though it was often over my head, I remember the frequent turns it would take toward some biblical subject, my subsequent failure to follow it, another quipp by Glenn or my dad, and then the whole room would erupt in laughter. It all served to normalize Christianity in the "grown-up" world I would later enter, and that was, and is, invaluable to me. Glenn Greer was a character - my dad, in casual remark, might have left it at that, with a chuckle of joy and gratitude - a character in my life whom the Lord used to buttress the early foundation of religion laid down by my parents and upon which my faith eventually would grow as tall as he was.

I never had any significant conversation with him that I can remember after I grew into an adult. I had left Tennessee by that time, never to return but for short visits. But I wonder what it would be like to engage him in conversation no longer as a boy. I would laugh as much as my dad did, I'm sure. I would leave loving Jesus more, I'm sure. And though the big blue Bible my dad read in those days doesn't speak much on the nature of the fellowship of the saints in heaven, I'm sure that he and my dad are now enjoying the full conversation, and holier, which they began during those visits in Portland or White House, and which I was blessed to overhear.
