Gwendolyn Bell Evans, age 81, of Greenbrier, passed away Friday, August 18, 2023 at Hickory Hills in Hendersonville. 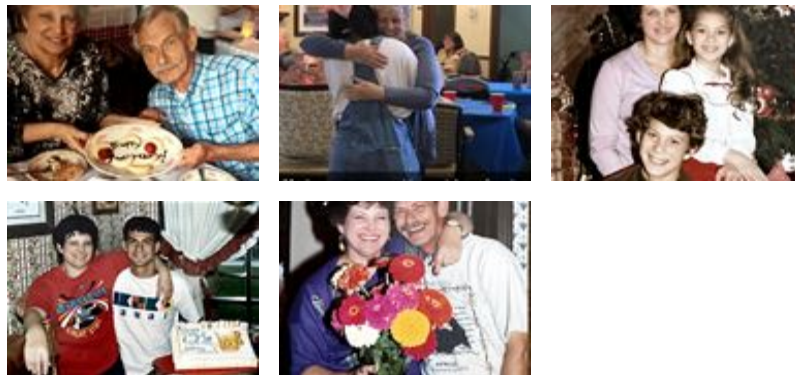
