August 1, 1934 - September 26, 2023

Age 89 of White House passed away Tuesday, September 26, 2023 at his home. He was born August 1, 1934 in Senath, MO to Joseph & Eva McDaniel Evans. He proudly served his country in the U.S. Army for 27 years, retiring as a Command Sgt Major. He then worked for the Petersburg, VA Sheriff's Department, where he retired with 21 years of service. He volunteered for Skyline Medical Center as an Ambassador for 13 years, working in Same Day Surgery and other departments. He enjoyed fishing, listening to country music and baseball. He could have been a professional baseball player but chose the military and service to his country instead. He was most proud to have been chosen by the Pentagon to attend Command Sgt Major Academy in Texas. He attended White House First United Methodist Church. He is preceded in death by his parents; 3 brothers; 3 sisters. He is survived by his loving wife of 68 years, Maxine Evans, White House, TN; daughter, Sue Evans, Portland, TN; nieces, Liv Justice and Michelle Stewart, both of White House, TN; nephew, Mike Stewart, Goodlettsville, TN. Funeral service is scheduled for Monday, October 2, 2023 at 2pm at White House First UMC Church in White House with Pastor Paul Edwards officiating. Interment will follow on Tuesday, October 3, 2023 at 11am in Middle Tennessee Veterans Cemetery with full military honors.
