James Albert Rodgers, age 81, of Lewisburg, KY, passed away Wednesday, February 7, 2018 at NorthCrest Medical Center in Springfield. A Graveside Service will be held Monday, February 12, 2018 at 11am in the Western Kentucky Veterans Cemetery. Burial will follow with family and friends serving as pallbearers.

Visitation will be held at the Austin & Bell Funeral Home in Springfield on Sunday, February 11, 2018 from 1-5pm. There will be no visitation prior to the graveside service on Monday.
