



Joe Murphey Teasley

February 14, 1929 - April 25, 2020

Joe Murphey Teasley, age 91, of the Sandy Springs/Gause community, passed away Saturday, April 25, 2020 at his home. A private family service will be held Saturday, May 9th with family members officiating. Burial will be in Elmwood Cemetery. Pallbearers will be Bryson Dew, Joe Dew, Donny King, Ryan King, Seth King, and Will Teasley. Honorary pallbearer will be Paul Bracey.

He was born February 14, 1929 in the Sandy Springs community to the late Will Farmer and Grace Murphey Teasley. He was preceded in death by his wife of 67 years, Lynda Dunn Teasley. He was also preceded in death by his siblings, Doug Teasley, Jean Dowlen, and Edith Nichols.

He was a graduate of Coopertown High School, Class of 1946. He attended Coopertown Church of Christ all 91 years of his life. He served as the song leader for many years as well as a deacon and an elder until he turned 90 years of age. He was raised on a farm and farmed his whole life. He was a Robertson County Commissioner for 16 years, then known as Quarterly Court. He served on the Planning and Zoning Commission 14 years, was the chairman and purchasing agent for the Robertson County Highway Department for 12 years and was a director for the Robertson Cheatham County Co-op for a number of years. He served on the National Advisory Committee for Tobacco Inspection Services. He was very active in Farm

Bureau for over 50 years, serving as vice president for several years and serving as president for 20 years. He was awarded the prestigious Distinguished Leader Award by the Tennessee Farm Bureau in 2006. He was a friend to all and loved by all. He never met a stranger. He loved and served his community. He loved and served the church. Very simply, he loved.

He is survived by son, Andy (Jenni) Teasley of Pleasant View; daughters, Dr. Myra (Joe Dew) Teasley of Raleigh, NC and Cara (Donny) King of Pleasant View; grandchildren Seth (Jenna) King, Ryan (Maite) King, Bethany (Kyle) Harman, Will (Kaeli Jo) Teasley, Lauren Teasley, and Bryson Dew; great grandchildren Evie King, Libby King, Georgia King, Silas King, Teddy Mac King, Joe Teasley and Jed Teasley; and sisters Evelyn White of Gallatin, Teady Justice of Cedar Hill, and Betty Potts of Vail, AZ.

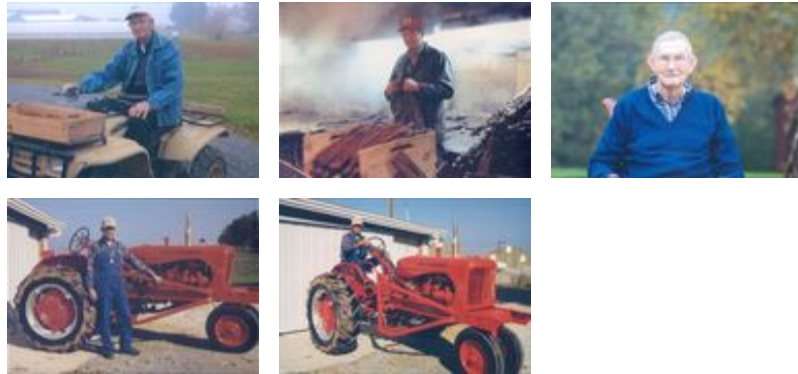
