



## Mary McIntosh Felts

January 22, 1938 - September 26, 2013

Mary McIntosh Felts, age 75, of Springfield, passed away Thursday, September 26, 2013 peacefully at her home with her family by her side after a courageous battle with cancer. Funeral services will be held Sunday, September 29, 2013 at 2pm in the chapel of the Austin & Bell Funeral Home in Springfield with Reverend Don Dungan, Reverend Rick Edwards and Reverend Ted Ingram officiating. Burial will follow in the Robertson County Memorial Gardens with Adam Pike, B.J. Felts, Josten Clayborn, Dallas Wilson, Christian Thomas, Carlton Newland, Steve Teague and Preston Murphy serving as pallbearers. In addition to her parents Mrs. Felts is preceded in death by her brothers, James Richmond McIntosh, Charles Thomas McIntosh and Joseph Donald McIntosh, her sister, Sarah Elizabeth Carney, and by two sons-in-law, Kenneth H. Mrs. Felts is survived by her husband of 57 years, Homer Felts, Jr; son, Barry (Robin) Felts of Springfield; daughters, Teresa (Brad Riddle) Parrish and Rhonda (Gayland) Hester, both of
