Many times while waiting for the fireworks she would decide she wanted to get back in the water but Meghan's way. She would run from the back of the boat to the front and jump off the bow and if she doused anyone well that was just fine with her and

being her creative feisty self loved to do it Meghan style. Her creativity grew every day. She recently began making large bows for doors during her free time. Each one more “Meghan” than the last.
