I’m Cheri, Micky and Linda’s older daughter. Our family wants you to know how much we appreciate your presence here and the outpouring of love you have blessed us with.

Since most of you have probably only known Dad a few years, I would like to share the Micky Hitt I know with you. My dad has always been my hero. In my earliest memories, he was tall and handsome, with dark hair and blue eyes, a Grand Ole Opry voice, strong, gentle hands and a mischievous spirit that showed in his smile. And he was a story-teller. The stories he told about growing up on Union Hill fascinated me. He would climb through the school window and run to his Grandma’s house. He liked riding cows across the pasture and rolling down the hill inside an old tire, Before he was even 10 he was already hunting squirrels for the family table and learning that skunk smell doesn’t come out of wool coats and it’s best not to shoot straight up into the air, especially near the house because you don’t want to have to explain the hole in the roof to your mom. When building bicycles from spare parts brakes aren’t necessary since a big toe stuck in the front fork will work fine most of the time. Driving from Goodlettsville to New York

is so easy even a 14yo can do it. And good friendships are invaluable so when you find one, keep it for life.

Daddy loved music. Thanks to him I learned about Kaw-Liga and Cheating Hearts, Hot rod Fords and two dollar bills, and that no matter how humble there is no place like Home Sweet Home. He was always either humming or singing, or playing harmonica or dulcimer. The song we just sang, Angry Words, was his all-time favorite,

He enjoyed many hours playing cards or board games, not ever worried about winning, just trying to make sure no else won either. He loved to boat, fish and water-ski and invent things like a plywood "idiot board" with his best friends so they could ski while sitting on a chair, and on vacation to the beach, they tried "surfing" the waves standing on giant inflatable feet!

Daddy loved "his girls" most of all, but he also loved his lawn mowers, old cars and guns. He built a few muzzleloaders from kits and enjoyed target shooting with them. Of course, muzzleloaders require black powder so he made homemade black powder. For many years there was a canister full of homemade black powder sitting in the back closet at the house.

Yesterday morning our church flier had this excerpt from I Corinthians. Of course my mind was filled with my dad so when I was reading this I naturally thought of him and as I did I realized that this describes how he chose to live his life and how I will remember him:

*Love is patient,
love is kind.*

*It does not envy,
it does not boast,
it is not proud.*

*It does not dishonor others,
it is not self-seeking,*

*it is not easily angered,
it keeps no record of wrongs.*

Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth.

It always protects,

*always trusts,
always hopes,
always perseveres.
Love never fails.
This describes my daddy.*
