Rick Dietsch, age 63, of Ashland City, died Wednesday, March 14th, 2012 at Skyline Medical Center. Funeral services will be conducted Sunday, March 18th, at 2 o'clock pm, in the chapel of Austin & Bell Funeral Home in Pleasant View with Rick Wilson officiating.
