In addition to his parents, he is preceded in death by a sister, Diane Traugher.

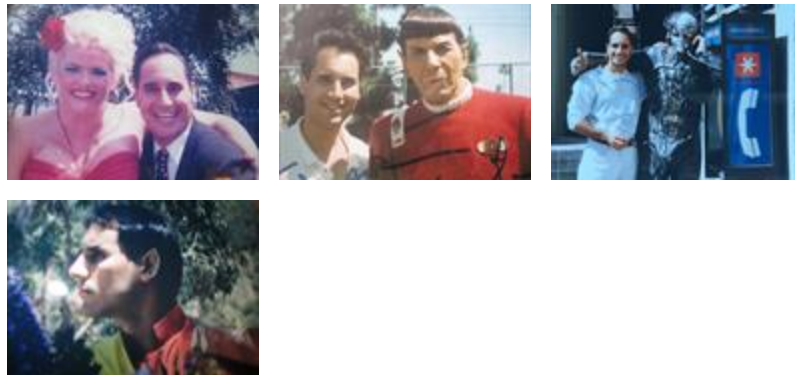
