Walter Edward Sullins, Sr., age 83 of White House, Tennessee, died Saturday, January 25, 2014.

Walter was born January 30, 1930, in Nashville, Tennessee. He was division chief of the railroad police at CSX Transportation, formerly Seaboard Systems and L&N Railroad, for over 31 years, from 1956 to 1987. His career was served in Nashville, Chattanooga and Montgomery, Alabama. He was a dedicated railroad employee and received numerous awards.

He was a veteran of the United States Air Force where he served in the Air Police. He is a longtime member of Kemper Heights Church of Christ in Madison, Tennessee.

Walter was the son of Jody Sullins and Bessie Scoggins Sullins and brother of S.T., Eugene, Joe, Juanita (Roberson) and Alton Sullins. Surviving siblings are Joe E. Sullins, Jr. and Juanita Roberson.
